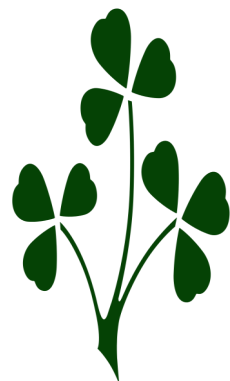

The Easter Bunny’s helpers were hard at work coloring eggs for the Easter Egg hunt held at the nursing home.

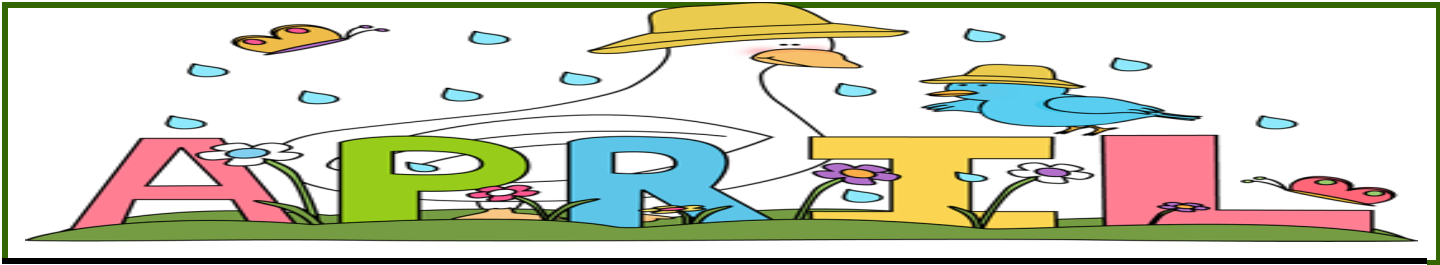

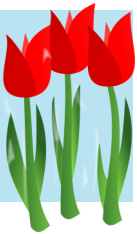
