### Chugwater FFA Receives \$1000

Chugwater FFA received \$1000 Working Here Fund grant designed to give students the opportunity to earn money for class-based jobs in supervised agriculture experiences. The grant is provided through Farm Credit Services of America's (FCSAmerica) Working Here Fund.

Chugwater's FFA hopes to use a work-based learning program to help agriculture education explore career paths while also earning money.

"Class-based jobs could evolve into economic resources for a struggling community," said Lindsey Freeman with Chugwater FFA. "There are few job opportunities in our community, and any potential for economic is meaningful."

The students are given time each Wednesday to complete the jobs assigned to them, but they also can do work outside the class. Once enough money is raised, Chugwater FFA plans to pay students once a month for their class-based jobs. In addition to filling out applications at various points, students will be asked to reflect on how they sustain and expand their work-based learning.

### **Penguin Treats**

1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk

1 c. butterscotch chips

1 tsp. vanilla

3/4 c. small pecan halves

1 (6 oz.) chocolate chips

1/4 c. butter or margarine

1 1/2 c. flour

Preheat oven to 350. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. In top of double boiler, combine sweetened condensed milk, chocolate chips, butterscotch chips, and butter. Stirring constantly, cook over simmering water until mixture is smooth. Remove from heat; add vanilla. Stir in flour. Drop by tsp. onto prepared baking sheet. Press a pecan half in each center of each cookie. Bake 7-9 min. (do not overbake). Cool cookies on baking sheet 2 min. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Store in air tight container.

1 1/2 c. powdered sugar


3/4 tsp. maple flavoring
