## **Approval of Agenda:**

## **Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes:**

Motion made by Councilperson Redding and seconded by Councilperson Clark to approve the minutes from the September 1, 2015 Special meeting regarding Fire Ordinance #295 (2<sup>nd</sup> Reading), September 2, 2015 Special meeting regarding Fire Ordinance #295 (3<sup>rd</sup> and Final Reading), and September 8, 2015 Town Council Meeting with change from handicapped parking signs painted at the Community Center to handicapped parking signs painted at the Business Center. - 2. Treasurer report, Patti Pierson.
  - Motion made by Councilperson Redding and seconded by Councilperson Schirmer to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented for public review. All in favor. Motion passed unanimously.

1. Ordinance #293 – Sewer

2. Ordinance #294 - Water
